



WHY A FOCUS ON TRANSITION TO NINTH GRADE?

Compared to other high school grades, ninth grade students nationally have

- + Lowest grade point average
- Most missed classes
- Most failing grades
- + Most misbehavior referrals
- + Highest enrollment because 22% are repeating the grade

Success in ninth grade is critical to on-time graduation from high school.




HIGH SCHOOL EXPECTATIONS

HIGH SCHOOL GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

- + HPS High School Credit Requirement (4x4)
- + Passing Score on Texas State Assessments (STAAR)
 - + Algebra I, Biology, English I-II, and US History
- + Admission by a **4-Year** College
- + Minimum **100** Community Service Hours
 - + Community service requirement is 25 hours per year.

- 4 Credits in Math, including Algebra II
- 4 Credits in Science
- Successful completion of an endorsement



Why it matters — Benefits

The Distinguished Level of Achievement opens a world of educational and employment opportunities for you beyond high school. The Distinguished Level of Achievement:

- Allows you to compete for Top 10% automatic admissions eligibility at any Texas public university;
- Positions you among those first in line for a TEXAS Grant* to help pay for university tuition and fees; and other financial aid options
- Ensures you are a more competitive applicant at the most selective colleges and universities.
- Prepares you for college-level coursework at community/technical colleges and universities
- Provides opportunity for immediate enrollment in classes related to your chosen field of study; and
- Lays a strong foundation to successfully complete an industry workforce credential or college degree.

To earn distinguished achievement students must complete:

- 4 credits in math (must include Alg II)
- 4 credits in science
- Curriculum requirements for at least one endorsement

- Every student must choose at least one. Arts& Humanities

 - Business & Industry STEM
 - Public Services
 - Multidisciplinary

Students must earn at least 4 additional credits to earn an endorsement. * Credits must meet

- 1 additional math
- curriculum requirements for
- 1 additional science 2 additional electives
- specific endorsements.

WHY US? (CONT ..)

- + School Environment-cultural diversity, small safety school, faculty quality, close relations between faculty and students
- College Readiness-approximately 85%-90%
- + Graduation rates approximately 99%
- State Distinguished Award- all seven possible distinctions for academic progress

WHY US? (CONT...)

- + Counseling Services-1-1 meeting, counselor student ratio is 1/200 compare to 1/450 at public schools, curriculum
- Academically challenged curriculum
- + Free SAT Classes within curriculum and free SAT test during Junior years
- + Academic competitions-Robotics, H-SEF, VEX, etc.
- + College Acceptances-Brown, Cornell, Harvard, NYU, Notre Dame, Emory, Stanford, USC, Yale, etc...
- + Extracurricular Activities-more than 55 clubs



Honor Courses

The Pre-AP Program serves as a stepping stone for students in preparation for rigorous AP courses. Participation provides students with a powerful opportunity to acquire the knowledge, concepts, and skills needed to engage in a higher level of learning.

Benefits:

- Rigorous course level
- 4.5 GPA calculation.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT (AP) COURSES

- + Advanced Placement (AP) courses are designed to help high achieving students earn *college credits* while in high school.
- + In order for students to earn college credits through AP courses, students must take and pass *the AP exam* at the end of the school year
- + Students who earns a *3 or higher* on the AP exam will earn college credit
- + If a student in unsuccessful on an AP exam, the AP exam grade will not appear on the student's *college transcript*
- + All AP courses carry a 5.0 weight



DUAL CREDIT

- + Dual Credit courses are designed to help student earn college credits while in high school
- + Students must take and pass the TSI exam in order to take a Dual Credit course
- + Students who enroll in Dual Credit courses will earn college credit at the end of the semester
- + Unlike AP, students in Dual Credit do not have to take an exam in order to earn college credit
- + Unlike AP, if a student is unsuccessful in Dual Credit, the grade will appear on the student's college transcript
- + All Dual Credit course carry an 5.0 weight



PROJECT LEAD THE WAY (PLTW)

- + PLTW courses give students the opportunity to learn how to solve real-world problems while collaborating with classmates
- + We offer courses in Computer Science, Biomedical Science and Engineering
- + The PLTW pathway provides students with an opportunity to earn college credit
- + All PLTW courses carry a 5.0 weight

Course Selection Process & Timeline

- + HSI-Sugar Land College & Career Counseling Website
- + Steps on the Course Selection
 - + Step 1: Review the Course Offerings with Your Teachers
 - + Step 2: Schedule a meeting with the student's counselor.
 - + DEADLINE: January 23, 2021 February 5, 2021
 - Step 3: During the Meeting;
 - + Select your courses and Do **NOT** forget to sign and copy of the following documents below for your records
 - + Personal Graduation Plan (PGP for Newcomers & 8th Grade Students)
 - + Course Selection Form-Finalized



Course Selection Process & Timeline

- + Step 4: Appeal Honors/AP/Dual Credit Courses if needed
 - If you need to appeal any Honors/AP/Dual Credit courses, please talk to your counselor and fill out the "AP/Dual Credit/Honors Course (s) Appeal Form" by Thursday, March 11, 2021 at 4:00 pm.
 - + No submissions will be accepted after the deadline.
- **Step 5:** Submit the "Schedule Request Change Form" by Friday, May 7th, 2021 at 4:00 pm if the student needs to change their schedule.

Please note that anything submitted after the deadline will **NOT** be considered.

Step 6: Contact your assigned counselor if you ever need help.


